-BENEFIT ROAD-MARCH FOR HEROES PROJECT



There are three primary requisites for membership in the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States: (1) U.S. Citizen or U.S. National (2) Honorable service in the Armed Forces of the United States (3) Service entitling the applicant to the award of a recognized campaign medal or as set forth in the Congressional Charter and By-Laws and Manual of Procedure and Ritual.

They can fill out an application, upload their DD-214 and pay all in one place.

### FREE LEGAL ADVICE FOR VETERANS

Coming up in September are free legal clinic for Veterans. These clinics provide lawyers to answer legal questions you may have about wills, trusts, health care directives, power of attorney, housing employment, debt collection, expungement, child support and family law. These services are totally free and you don't need an appointment, just walk in. I can't stress enough the importance of your spouse and yourself having valid "power of attorney" documents on each other. In case of sickness or death these documents will save you numerous headaches and heartaches. Here are the dates for the upcoming Veteran Legal Clinics:

Just bring a copy of your DD-214 to show proof that you are a Veteran and have your questions ready for the Legal Team.

### TRI CARE ISSUES

#### Do you have TICARE Retiree Dental Program (TRDP) coverage now?

If so, then you need to know that TRDP will end on Dec.31. 2018 Not to worry – Anyone who was in TRDP this year or would have been eligible for the plan will be able to choose a dental plan from among 10 dental carriers in the Federal Employee Dental and Vision Insurance Program (FEDVIPI). You can begin reviewing program options now at <a href="https://www.opm.gov/fedvip">www.opm.gov/fedvip</a>. You'll be able to enroll in FEDVIP during the 2018 Federal Benefits Open Season which runs from Nov 12 to Dec 10, 2018: coverage will begin on Jan 1, 2019.

Previously, FEDVIP wasn't available to Dept. of Defense beneficiaries but it will now be available to those eligible for TRDP. As a bonus, they will also be able to enroll in FEDIP vision coverage, along with most active duty family members.

More than 3.3 million people are currently covered by FEDVIP. You can choose from dental plans offered by 10 different carriers. To enroll in FEDVIP vision, you must be enrolled in a <u>TRICARE health plan</u>. You can decide if one of four vision plans meets you family's needs, TRICARE Young Adult enrollees are not eligible to enroll in FEDVIP vision.

For more information, visit FEDVIP website at http://tricare.benefeds.com and sign up for email notifications. You'll get an email when new information is available and keep dates approach. Future updates will include eligibility information, plans, carries, rates, educational webinars and more.

#### Moving this summer? Your TRICARE Options May Change

Are you starting a new adventure in a new location soon? If so, that's a TRICARE Qualifying Life Event (QLE). A QLE is a major life change, like moving, getting married or divorced, or becoming eligible for Medicare. Moving doesn't change your TRICARE eligibility. But moving may change your TRICARE health plan options. For more info check with your service officer.

### **Faster VA Claims Decisions**

If your service-connected condition has gotten worse and you're planning to file an increased disability claim for that condition, there's a better way to file. Get the fastest decision on your claim for an increase by filing it as a <u>Decision Ready Claim (DRC)</u>. Filing as a DRC means you can get a decision within 30 days after your claim is submitted.

### Changes in Your Life May Mean Changes to Your TRICARE Options

Life changes, for you and your family, may also change your TRICARE options. With TRICARE, certain life events (like moving due to a permanent change of station, getting married or divorced, adopting or having a baby, becoming Medicare eligible or losing health coverage) are called Qualifying Life Events (QLEs). ## Poppy Program

### **Buddy Poppy**



Before Memorial Day in 1922, we conducted our first poppy distribution, becoming the first veterans' organization to organize a nationwide distribution. The poppy soon was adopted as the official memorial flower of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States, as it remains today.

During our 1923 encampment, we decided that VFW "Buddy"® Poppies would be assembled by disabled and needy veterans who would be paid for their work to provide them with financial assistance. The next year, disabled veterans at the Buddy Poppy factory in Pittsburgh assembled VFW Buddy Poppies. The designation "Buddy Poppy" was adopted at that time.

In February 1924, we registered the name Buddy Poppy with the U.S. Patent Office. A certificate was issued on May 20, 1924, granting our organization all trademark rights in the name of Buddy under the classification of artificial flowers. We've made that trademark a guarantee that all poppies bearing that name and the VFW label are genuine products of the work of disabled and needy veterans. No other organization, firm or individual can legally use the name Buddy Poppy.


Today, our Buddy Poppies are still assembled by disabled and needy veterans in VA Hospitals.

The VFW Buddy Poppy program provides compensation to the veterans who assemble the poppies, provides financial assistance in maintaining state and national veterans' rehabilitation and service programs and partially supports the VFW National Home For Children.

# Legislation

Hello Palmer Lake Comrades, Friends, and Family!

My name is Larry Fonder and Commander Jarrod McReynolds recently appointed me as the Post's Legislative Chairperson. I am honored to accept the appointment and pledge to keep you informed of legislative actions and priorities, so we can apply the knowledge to better serve our community.

As I began researching, I discovered that on a national scale, the Veterans of Foreign Wars has 41 legislative goals grouped into eight categories (see webpage link) – that is a shotgun blast of priorities! My goal is get a bit more focused, and scale the shotgun down to aimed rifle fire. To do so, I intend to apply guidance from our monthly General Orders, work in conjunction with the Post Auxiliary Legislative Chair, and take input from post community members so we may identify priorities with the most direct impact on our community. Then, I'll pair those priorities with state and federal efforts that we can affect.

For example, H.R. 299, The Bluewater Navy Vietnam Veterans Act of 2017 (Read More) passed in the U.S. House of Representatives on 25 June 2018 and is now in the Senate. Passing of this act would afford Navy veterans who served in the waters of Vietnam (Blue water veterans) the same presumption for service connection to diseases associated to exposure to Agent Orange (AO) as veterans who served "boots on the ground" or in the river ways (Brown water veterans). Thus paving the way for blue water veterans suffering diseases associated to AO to receive compensation and healthcare from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs. Our action: email or write to our Senators Amy Klobuchar (Amy Klobuchar) and Tina Smith (Tina Smith) and urge them to help ensure S.422, The Bluewater Navy Vietnam Veterans Act of 2017 passes the Senate.

To help meet the needs of our community, I would like to hear from our post community. Please take a look at the VFW national priorities (Read More) and let me know what resonates with you. Which priorities are affecting you?
