

donating to the project at the last minute, without your generous donation; we would not have been able to complete the project.



FREE LEGAL ADVICE FOR VETERANS



Coming up in June and September are free legal clinics for Veterans. These clinics provide lawyers to answer legal questions you may have about wills, trusts, health care directives, power of attorney, housing employment, debt collection, expungement, child support and family law. These services are totally free and you don't need an appointment, just walk in. I can't stress enough the importance of your spouse and yourself having valid "power of attorney" documents on each other. In case of sickness or death these documents will save you numerous headaches and heartaches. Here are the dates for the upcoming Veteran Legal Clinics:

Just bring a copy of your DD-214 to show proof that you are a Veteran and have your questions ready for the Legal Team.

All Veterans with a 0-100% rating from the VA will get a free yearly State of Minnesota park pass. Just bring your VA ID card to the park office to get your yearly sticker.

The Disabled Veterans Camp at Big Marine Lake in Scandia, MN and the Veterans on the Lake Resort in Ely, MN are both looking forward to another year of serving our Veterans. Look them up on "google" to put in your reservations or to get your questions answered

President Donald Trump has signed a bill into law that will expand private care for veterans as an alternative to the troubled Veterans Affairs health system. At a Rose Garden event Wednesday June 6th, Trump praised the legislation as helping to achieve his campaign pledge to fix the VA by bringing accountability and widening access to private doctors. He said veterans who have been standing "in line for weeks and weeks" seeking care at VA can now "go see a doctor." The \$51 billion measure builds on legislation passed in 2014 in response to a scandal at the Phoenix VA medical center, where some veterans died while waiting months for appointments. It will allow veterans, with the approval of a VA provider, to see private doctors when they do not receive treatment they expected.

Possible clothing allowance

Did you know that you may be eligible for an annual clothing allowance if you use a prosthetic or orthopedic?

Appliance and/or medication for a service connected skin condition that causes permanent damage to your outer garments?

If you're eligible, and you haven't yet applied for this year, you need to act fast! If you have already submitted your application, then no further action is required on your part. Your application should be submitted on or before August 1, 2018. To apply, submit (in person, by mail, or fax)VA Form 10-8678, Application for Annual Clothing Allowance, to the Prosthetic and Sensory Aids Service at your local VA medical center.

TRI CARE ISSUES

Do you have TICARE Retiree Dental Program (TRDP) coverage now?

If so, then you need to know that TRDP will end on Dec.31. 2018 Not to worry – Anyone who was in TRDP this year or would have been eligible for the plan will be able to choose a dental plan from among 10 dental carriers in the Federal Employee Dental and Vision Insurance Program (FEDVIPI). You can begin reviewing program options now at www.opm.gov/fedvip. You'll be able to enroll in FEDVIP during the 2018 Federal Benefits Open Season which runs from Nov 12 to Dec 10, 2018: coverage will begin on Jan 1, 2019.

Previously, FEDVIP wasn't available to Dept of Defense beneficiaries but it will now be available to those eligible for TRDP. As a bonus, they will also be able to enroll in FEDIP vision coverage, along with most active duty family members.

More than 3.3 million people are currently covered by FEDVIP. You can choose from dental plans offered by 10 different carriers. To enroll in FEDVIP vision, you must be enrolled in a <u>TRICARE health plan</u>. You can decide if one of four vision plans meets you family's needs, TRICARE Young Adult enrollees are not eligible to enroll in FEDVIP vision.

For more information, visit FEDVIP website at http://tricare.benefeds.com and sign up for email notifications. You'll get an email when new information is available and keep dates approach. Future updates will include eligibility information, plans, carries, rates, educational webinars and more.

Moving this summer? Your TRICARE Options May Change

Are you starting a new adventure in a new location soon? If so, that's a TRICARE Qualifying Life Event (QLE). A QLE is a major life change, like moving, getting married or divorced, or becoming eligible for Medicare. Moving doesn't change your TRICARE eligibility. But moving may change your TRICARE health plan options. For more info check with your service officer.

Faster VA Claims Decisions

If your service-connected condition has gotten worse and you're planning to file an increased disability claim for that condition, there's a better way to file. Get the fastest decision on your claim for an increase by filing it as a <u>Decision Ready Claim (DRC)</u>. Filing as a DRC means you can get a decision within 30 days after your claim is submitted.

Work with an accredited Veterans Service Organization (VSO) or other accredited representative to determine if the DRC program is right for you and your claim for an increase. Your VSO can then help you gather and submit all relevant and required evidence so your claim is ready for VA to make a decision when you submit it.

Don't need to file a claim for an increase? You can also file these other types of compensation claims through the DRC program:

- Direct Service Connection Claims
- Presumptive Service Connection Claims
- Secondary Service Connection Claims
- Dependency and Indemnity Compensation for surviving spouses

With TRICARE, certain life events (like moving due to a permanent change of station, getting married or divorced, adopting or having a baby, becoming Medicare eligible or losing health coverage) are called Qualifying Life Events (QLEs).
